About Project Gado: Project Gado has created an autonomous open source archival scanning robot which small archives can use to digitize their photographic

small archives can use to digitize their photographic collections. Funded by the Abell Foundation, the project grew out of the Johns Hopkins University Center for Africana Studies, and now includes the JHU Sheridan Libraries and the Afro-American Newspapers. The Gado 2 has been tested on flat photographs in the archives of the Afro-American Newspapers where Project Gado has digitized over 30,000 images. These

images are now available on <u>Gado Images</u>, a website which provides historical photo licenses and prints from the Afro-American Newspapers. Many images are newly digitized, and many





have never been published previously. These images serve as the inspiration for "Imagine Johns Hopkins."




